Purpose: To honor a young and emerging professional in the San Francisco Chapter who has significantly impacted the profession or his/her community.

The award is intended to recognize the diverse contributions of young and emerging professionals, whether in a professional or personal capacity, paid or unpaid, and whether the nominee is inspired or inspiring. This award also acknowledges and promotes the enormous strides made by our young and emerging professionals to be viewed as leaders in their professional competency and their integrity by their clients, employers, the public and their government officials.

Criteria: The nominee must be a CalCPA member.

Individuals nominated may be chosen from any facet of the accounting profession. The nominee may be a practicing accountant in private, public, or government accounting.

The nominee should be an individual who has 1-5 years of work experience and has made an immediate or sustained contribution to their firm, company or community. The nominee is not required to be licensed.

Any of the following characteristics may qualify a nominee:

- An individual who has made a significant contribution to his/her community through charity or voluntary work;
- An individual who has had to overcome significant adversity or challenge to make a difference or to succeed personally or professionally;
- An individual whose behavior, actions, words or achievements have inspired others;
- An individual who has shown a continued effort to share his/her ideas of how to improve and modernize the CPA profession;
- An individual who demonstrates leadership and team work in his/her profession.
